Activity I.2: Respect Time: 10 minutes

Purpose

To define what respect looks like and sounds like in action.

Materials Needed

- Chart Paper
- Markers
- Respect Activity Sheet (see below)

Roles

- I. Facilitator: Mange the activity as a think-pair-share
- 2. Participants: Engage in conversations and participate in activity

Activity

- 1. Think about what you would expect to see and hear as evidence that respect for families is exercised by school personnel.
- 2. Independently, participants will spend several minutes brainstorming their thoughts on what family respect looks and sounds like.
- 3. After the independent brainstorms are completed, participants will pair up with another colleague and share the results of their brainstorm.
- 4. Have each dyad share out their results, with the facilitator scripting results on chart paper.
- 5. The facilitator might consider using the charted results from this activity and ask the staff to develop a performance feedback instrument based on the tangible evidence of family respect; establish staff competencies for exercising family respect; and/or establish school-wide rule for respect.
